Level I & Level 2 Bowls Coaching Award

Our Level I course is for coaches working with developing players (either new to the sport or looking to move out of the beginner phase). Our Level I courses last for I day with most of the course being delivered on the green in a face-to-face capacity.

Our Level 2 Bowls Coaching Award is a multi-day course helping club coaches improve their skills and knowledge to work with players involved in development pathways.

Introduction to Coaching Para Bowls

Our newest course is designed to allow coaches more confidence and understanding in working with Para Bowlers, either when they first enter the sport, or as they develop. The course covers a wide range of equipment, rules and pathways options as well as helping develop clubs to be more open and inclusive.
