Key Characteristics

- You must be open and honest, advising the board on the delivery within budget of the competitions.
- A team player who can be available during the day for meetings and must be available to support the delivery of the National Championships during the week of events.
- A director who can overview, advise and delegate.

As part of the appointment process you are asked to submit a CV with a covering letter outlining why you feel you are the right candidate for the role.

To sign and adhere to all relevant Bowls Scotland policies and as such, they should fulfil all legal criteria to become a director of a company. You will be expected to play an active part in all board discussions.
