



Bowls Scotland Bye Laws

District Coordinators

- 1.1 Bowls Scotland District Coordinators will support the delivery of Bowls Scotland aims and objectives within a district setting
- 1.2 Ideally there will be two District Coordinators for each district – one to oversee the co-ordination of Stage 1 of the National Championships for the female competitions and one to oversee the male competitions within their district
- 1.3 A District Coordinator must be a member of a Bowls Scotland affiliated club. Should a District Coordinator cease to be a member of a Bowls Scotland affiliated club Bowls Scotland will appoint a new District Coordinator
- 1.4 District Coordinators will be recruited based on their skills and ability to carry out the minimum role requirements
- 1.5 Any member of a Bowls Scotland affiliated club can apply to be a District Coordinator within their District
- 1.6 Members can view the District Coordinator role descriptor for details on the main functions, duties, and requirements of a District Coordinator
- 1.7 Newly appointed District Coordinators will be provided with an induction programme and assigned to a mentor to support and help them settle into their role
- 1.8 District Coordinators will be invited to District Coordinator meetings throughout the year as and when required – both district and nationally. These can either be face-to-face meeting or virtual online meetings. There will be a minimum of one face to face meeting per year held in a central location within Scotland. Virtual meetings can be held as often as required
- 1.9 A District Coordinator can hold their position for up to a period of 4 years where upon they will be subject to a re-election process
- 1.10 District Coordinators will automatically be eligible for nomination for honorary membership following 10 consecutive years of service. The nomination will be made upon the resignation of their position
- 1.11 District Coordinators are required to adhere to all relevant Bowls Scotland policies and procedures
