Job Purpose:	 To deliver high quality Intro to Bowls Coaching Award sessions on the green. To assist and mentor local coaches in your local area. To highlight areas in your locality where new Coaching Courses would help clubs to develop further. 	

Key Tasks

- Deliver fun Coach Education Courses (2-3 hours each course) to provide candidates with the skills and knowledge required to lead fun, safe and positive coaching sessions at their own club. Coaches are 16 years old or above.
- Act as a Coach Mentor for those coaches in your local area who require extra assistance/guidance on developing their coaching skills.
- Attend Tutor Development Days as and when required.
- Attend Coach Development Days/Networking Events as and when required.
- Aid and assist C&V Manager to identify excellent Coaching Practice, and opportunities for development in your local area.
- Always adhere to Volunteer Coach Tutor Code of Conduct when in a local bowling environment.

Regularity of Work

- As and when required in your local area.
- Estimated at 1 or 2 courses per season, however if demand is high it may be more than this.
