

Bowls Scotland Bye Laws

District Co-Ordinators

- I.I Bowls Scotland District Co-Ordinators will support the delivery of Bowls Scotland aims and objectives within a district setting
- I.2 Ideally there will be two District Co-Ordinators for each district one to oversee the co-ordination of Stage I of the National Championships for the female competitions and one to oversee the male competitions within their district
- I.3 A District Co-Ordinator must be a member of a Bowls Scotland affiliated club. Should a District Co-Ordinator cease to be a member of a Bowls Scotland affiliated club Bowls Scotland will appoint a new District Co-Ordinator
- I.4 District Co-Ordinators will be recruited based on their skills and ability to carry out the minimum role requirements
- 1.5 Any member of a Bowls Scotland affiliated club can apply to be a District Co-Ordinator within their District
- 1.6 Members can view the District Co-Ordinator role descriptor for details on the main functions, duties, and requirements of a District Co-Ordinator
- I.7 Newly appointed District Co-Ordinators will be provided with an induction programme and assigned to a mentor to support and help them settle into their role I.8 District Co-Ordinators will be invited to District Co-Ordinator meetings throughout the year as and when required both district and nationally. These can either be face-to-face meeting or virtual online meetings. There will be a minimum of one face-to-face meeting per year held in a central location within Scotland. Virtual meetings can be held as often as required
- 1.9 A District Co-Ordinator can hold their position for up to a period of four years where upon they will be subject to a re-election process
- 1.10 District Co-Ordinators will automatically be eligible for nomination for honorary membership following 10 consecutive years of service. The nomination will be made upon the resignation of their position
- I.II District Co-Ordinators are required to adhere to all relevant Bowls Scotland policies and procedures
- 1.12 For the purposes of Bowls Scotland National Competitions, whereby a player/official is engaged in National Selection events or representing Bowls Scotland at recognised tournaments/events, that player/official shall be entitled to an extension to any Bowls Scotland competition to enable participation in that competition. Such extension shall be at a date mutually agreeable by the clubs, failing which a date and time shall be set either by the District Co-Ordinator or by Bowls Scotland.
